Introduction

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Christian formation process for children between the ages of 3 and 12 years. The central aim of this faith formation program is to enable the child to experience and form an authentic relationship with God.

The Catechesis is grounded in scripture and the liturgy of the church, then framed by Montessori principles of education. This allows children to hear the Gospels through the use of sensorial rich materials. The children are free to work with these materials that represent essential proclamations of the Christian message.



The adult's task is to prepare the sacred space for the children called the Atrium, so that they can respond to this relationship, first proclaimed to them through the image of Jesus the Good Shepherd.

The Atrium is a place of community and worship rather than a place of academic study. It is a place to be with and enjoy God, listen to the Word and to pray. It is designed to reflect the beauty of creation and God's abiding love.

The vision for this faith formation began in 1954 with Dr. Sofia Cavalletti, a Hebrew and scripture scholar and member of the Vatican Commission for Jewish Christian relations and her colleague, Professor Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori Educator.

Dr. Cavalletti began her work of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd with young children in Rome, Italy. She found that in working with children in this way, whatever their culture, they have vital religious needs, and they respond in similar ways to the most essential elements of the Christian message.

Children desire to be near to God but need the sensitive guidance of the adult as well as the inner guidance of the Holy Spirit to nurture this relationship.

Today, the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd has grown and spread amazingly. At last count, CGS is present in 39 different countries around the world.

Course Description and Aims

Level One, Part 1 (6.5 days). This course is the foundational course for all three age levels of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and aims to:

- To explore with participants the general developmental characteristics, religious nature, and religious needs of 3- to 12-year-olds with special attention to the child aged 3-6.
- To offer guidelines and assistance to catechists in setting up an atrium for 3- to 6-year-old children, preparing presentations, album pages and making materials.
- To meditate on the Biblical and Liturgical themes of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This method was first developed by Dr. Sofia Cavalletti and Professor Gianna Gobbi in Rome, Italy and has been used now for over sixty years in various places throughout the world.
- To experience being formed as catechists by the Word of God and deepening our ability to observe and learn from the children the joy of the Gospel!

Course Details

This weekend is the solid foundation of the full Level 1, Part 1 course. Participants who complete Level I Part I, will be able to continue onto part 2 and finish the 3-6 formation.

The Level 2 Course focuses on children aged 6-9

The Level 3 Course focuses on children aged 9-12.

What to Expect from the Course

The Level 1 training offers a personal retreat like experience as well as providing participants with the necessary background to set up a prepared environment and begin working with 3–6-year-old children in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. The course covers the pedagogy, history, philosophy, theology, liturgy, and practical working with and making materials for the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

Although designed for training catechists, this course is an opportunity for personal faith formation and enrichment, and an opportunity to deepen your understanding of the spiritual, physical, and emotional development of children.

The course will be in person in the Atrium. The course facilitator will be Camille Corson who has years of experience working with this method in our Archdiocese along with the support of the local team, Brigid Marsden and Anna Abraham (originally trained and experienced from SA and NZ). Our nationally accredited formation leaders will be present by zoom - Marie Fernandez (Perth) and Julie Zaar (Melb.).

Please Bring: your bible, a notebook, paper, pens, **charged** laptop, and camera (if you wish), but please no video devices; Tea and coffee and morning/afternoon tea will be provided.
